

2022-2023 OPENING OF SCHOOL GUIDELINES

MASK

- Masks are encouraged but not required
- Masks are available upon request in school and on buses

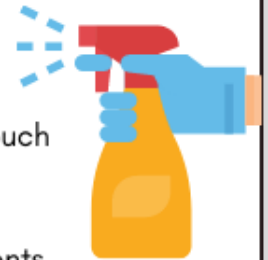


BUS TRANSPORTATION

- Sanitizer is available
- Buses are cleaned daily

CLEANING

- Hygiene protocols are stressed (frequent washing/sanitizing of hands, cover mouth when coughing or sneezing)
- Sanitizing chemicals, spray bottles, hand sanitizer, and antibacterial foaming hand soap provided to all schools
- Normal cleaning with continued attention to student restrooms and high-touch areas by custodians
- Cafeteria tables are cleaned throughout the day
- Foggers or Nebula Sprayers are utilized for classroom or school closure events



FACILITIES

- Sanitizing stations will remain throughout each facility
- Water fountains & water refill stations are used to fill or refill bottles and cups only; students are encouraged to bring water bottles

MEAL PROCEDURES

- Meals are provided to all students at no cost to them
- Lunches are consumed in the cafeteria
- Students should wash/sanitize hands before and after meals



VISITORS ON CAMPUS

- Visitors are permitted to conduct school-related business
- Mentors and volunteers are allowed to assist students

EXTRACURRICULUM ACTIVITIES/ATHLETICS

- All extracurricular activities, both athletic and academic, will continue as intended
- Athletic event attendance is at normal capacity



ATTENDANCE

- Parents - if your child has a fever or flu-like symptoms, please keep him/her at home
- Elementary school attendance is taken daily
- Middle and high school attendance is taken by period

STAY HOME WITH THESE SYMPTOMS

- Most common: fever, persistent cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell
- Other symptoms: severe fatigue, muscle aches, headache, sore throat, heavy chest congestion, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, heavy nasal congestion/drainage.
- Students who are positive for COVID-19 are required to isolate at home for five days from the positive test and/or onset of symptoms
- Students who are close contacts with COVID-19 cases, who do NOT exhibit symptoms, are NOT required to quarantine



**Students with these symptoms should consult with their health care provider*

SCHOOL/CLASS CLOSURE GUIDANCE

- If the number of students positive for COVID-19 within a school or class at one time nears or exceeds 20%, temporary quarantine of the entire class or school will be considered and determined.

Additional Factors to Consider:

- Instances of multiple positive cases within the same school/class, at one time
- Length of time since confirmed positive cases were present in the school/class
- Any additional students or staff within the school/class exhibiting symptoms
- Grade-band and mobility of the school/class impacted
- Teaching and learning implications based on number of students and staff presently quarantined
- To be determined in conjunction with the Superintendent's Office, Division of Student Support Services, and Division of Teacher and Leader Effectiveness
- If a school and/or the district are impacted by a high volume of staff COVID-19 positives that impact safe and effective operations, closure of the school/district may be considered and determined
